Having working smoke alarms in your home cuts your chances of dying in a house fire by 50 percent! If you have smoke alarms, but they don't work, they cannot protect you. Here are some reasons why it is important for every household to have working smoke alarms:

- Almost all U.S. homes have at least one smoke alarm, but almost two-thirds of home fire deaths resulted from fires in homes without working smoke alarms.
- In 2009, home fires killed one person every three hours and 25 minutes or roughly seven people every day.
- In 2009, someone was reported injured in a fire every 31 minutes.

The theme of this year's Fire Prevention Week focuses on how to protect your family from fire by planning ahead and integrating simple behaviors into your everyday life. By equipping your home with fire prevention and protection systems and paying attention to potential fire hazards in your home, you can make a difference that will last a lifetime and reduce fire injuries, deaths, and property loss.
