

BUILD YOUR FAMILY'S BASIC SUPPLY KIT

- ✓ Water – one gallon per person per day
- ✓ Food – a minimum of a three-day supply
- ✓ Weather Radio – battery-powered with extra batteries
- ✓ Flashlight – extra batteries
- ✓ First Aid Kit
- ✓ Whistle – to signal for help
- ✓ Filter Mask or Cotton T-shirt – to help filter the air
- ✓ Moist Towelettes – to keep your family clean
- ✓ Wrench or Pliers – to turn off utilities
- ✓ Manual Can Opener – to open canned food
- ✓ Plastic Sheeting and Duct Tape – to seal your family inside your home during a shelter-in-place
- ✓ Garbage Bags and Plastic Ties – to meet personal sanitation needs
- ✓ Unique Family Needs – daily prescription medications, infant formula or diapers, and important documents

DISASTER RISK FOR PLANO

Listed below are disasters most likely to occur in Plano.

- ✦ Plano is located in the Trinity Valley flood plain.
- ✦ We are also on the tip of a geographical area known as tornado alley.
- ✦ Hazardous materials are transported through Plano on major highways; therefore a spill could affect Plano.
- ✦ During winter months, Plano can experience high winds, hail and ice storms.
- ✦ Plano is also susceptible to major thunderstorms, bringing damaging lightning and hail, that may cause power outages.



GET PREPARED FOR EMERGENCIES

- ▶ Take a basic class in first aid and CPR.
- ▶ Teach all family members how to turn on and off vital utilities.
- ▶ Pick two emergency meeting places.
- ▶ Know the safe spots in your home for disasters.
- ▶ Know your out-of-state contact's phone number.
- ▶ Discuss how to handle power outages.
- ▶ Know your home and city evacuation routes.
- ▶ Have supplies on hand for all the needs of your family, including food and water, for at least three days.
