## Plano's District 2 Neighborhood Roundtable Scheduled for Dec. 10

On Thursday, Dec. 10, the Plano Mayor and City Council will meet with District 2 residents in a Neighborhood Roundtable discussion. The two-hour meeting begins at 7 p.m. at the Tom Muehlenbeck Recreation Center, 5801 W. Parker Road.

The evening's agenda will include:
