Chinese Film Festival at Davis Library

The Chinese Film Festival at Davis Library, 7501-B Independence Parkway, will feature films on Saturday afternoons at 2 p.m. The films are subtitled in English, and free to the public.

Saturday, Feb. 6 – *Red Cliff II (for adults 18 and up)*

In the early third century, the land of Wu is invaded by the warlord Cao Cao and his soldiers. The ruler of Wu, Sun Quan (Chang Chen), calls on the rival warlord Liu Bei (You Yong) for help, but their two armies are still badly outnumbered. However, the strategists Zhou Yu (Tony Leung) and Zhuge Liang (Takeshi Kaneshiro) see that Cao Cao's army is unused to battling at sea. With 200,000 men, Zhou Yu and Zhuge Liang defeat Cao Cao's army at the Yangtze River.

Saturday, Feb. 13 – *If you are the one (for adults 18 and up)*

A self-made entrepreneur, Chin has never had much luck in the love department. He puts out a personal ad on Match.com hoping to find a relationship. After a string of bizarre encounters and bad dates, he finally strikes a chord with the beautiful Xiaoxiao. A story about love in comical situations, it depicts how difficult it often is to find the right person, but also how love often hits at the most unexpected times.

Saturday, Feb. 20 – *Forever Enthralled (for adults 18 and up)*

A biographical account of Mei Lanfang, China's greatest opera star. Descended from an acting family, Mei's popularity soon made him a rival to veteran actor Swallow 13. The two face off in a musical "duel" from which Mei emerges the victor. As his fame spreads, the late 1920s see him even performing on Broadway, but disaster sets in with the Japanese invasion of Manchuria. Mei's refusal to sing in public under the occupation proves career-threatening.

Saturday, Feb. 27 – *Pleasant Goat and Big, Big Wolf (for all ages)*

Based on the animated TV series for children by the same name, the story of the clash
