Plano Multi-Cultural Group paves the way with Free Citizenship Workshop

The Plano Multi-Cultural Outreach Roundtable (MCOR) is hosting a **Citizenship Workshop** on Saturday, April 17 for all local residents seeking to become United States citizens. The Workshop will be held at the Sockwell Center located at 6301 Chapel Hill Boulevard from 2:00pm to 4:00pm.

MCOR's event is designed to help immigrants learn about the benefits of citizenship, and have access to experts able to help make the application process easier. During the Workshop representatives from the U.S. Immigration and Naturalization Service, the FBI, the English as a 2nd Language Center, and Citizenship Class Centers will all make presentations focusing on various aspects of becoming a USA citizen. They will address questions relating to 'who can apply,' 'how to apply,' 'when/where to file' and receive information about official policies and background checks.

Immigration attorneys will also be at the MCOR Citizenship Workshop to provide individual consultations in various languages including Arabic, Chinese and Spanish. To insure no component of the citizenship application process is neglected, U.S. Postal Service staff will be on-site to issue money orders for the application fees and assist in mailing the completed applications.

Plano residents who attend the workshop are encouraged to bring all pertinent documentation to the meeting if they wish to have the panel of experts review the paperwork. Light refreshments will be served; but no childcare services will be provided.
