

5. Begin your community service project!



Litter Cleanup Map




Storm Drain Marking Map

Alley Cleanup Descriptions

17 alleys in the Fall 2011 Love Where You Live project area need a community service project. These alleys were assessed by city staff and scaled on 3 levels of difficulty (Level 1 – easy, Level 2 – moderate, and Level 3 – difficult) to help volunteers determine the need.

There are Seven Level 1 Alleys (shaded green on map above).

- These alleys primarily need tree trimming or clipping. Equipment needed might include pole saws, edge clippers, wheel barrels, etc.

There are Five Level 2 Alleys (shaded yellow on map above).

- These alleys primarily need tree trimming or clipping, litter pickup, leaves bagged, etc. Equipment needed might include pole saws, edge clippers, wheel barrels, landscape bags, trash bags, and litter pickup sticks.

There are Five Level 3 Alleys (shaded red on map above).

- These alleys need an alley sweep, which includes tree trimming or clipping, litter pickup, bagging leaves, mowing overgrown grass and weeds. Equipment needed might include lawn mowers, weed eaters, pole saws, edge clippers, wheel barrels, trash & landscape bags, litter pickup sticks, etc.

Unless accompanied by a parent on October 1, no one under the age of 18 will be permitted to help with alley cleanup.

Volunteer groups should contact Monique Coleman to sign up for an alley cleanup project, acquire the necessary tools, supplies, and people needed to complete the project – *staff may be able to provide some tools such as pole saws & clippers*. The group leader should inspect the alley before Oct. 1. During the project, all trash should be bagged in black bags and left at the ends of alleys. All landscape debris cleared from alleys should be taken to the landscape debris dumping site at Meadows Elementary/Head Start parking lot on October 1.
