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

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Project Structure

- Pyramid
 - **Project Leaders** are the project organizer and primary point of contact. Project Leaders are responsible for making sure the crews have everything they need to successfully conduct the projects for their assigned blocks.
 - **Crew Leaders** work with the Project Leader to determine project scope and scale.
 - Each Crew Leader recruits the **volunteers** needed to meet the needs of his or her block
 - Each Crew Leader will be responsible for his or her crew.
 - Each Crew Leader must register with the City's VIP Services
 - Each Crew Leader must have all crew volunteers sign a waiver of liability before work begins.

Who are the Project Leaders?

- **Neighborhood Cleanup Project**
 - Rick Schickedanz, City of Plano Property Standards
 - **Needs 13 Crew Leaders** (1 leader per block, 2 blocks will be covered by community service workers and City staff)
- **Curb Painting Project**
 - Jill Smola, SCC Habitat for Humanity
 - **Needs 15 Crew Leaders** (1 leader per block)
- **Housing Repair & Landscaping Projects**
 - Kenny Nall, SCC Habitat for Humanity
 - Project Selection Meeting for Faith Groups

Neighborhood Cleanup

- **Project Leader:** Rick Schickedanz
- Passing out flyers
- Need 13 Crew Leaders (explain criteria)
- Project conducted with two areas of concentration:
 - Alleys Clearance
 - Neighborhood & Home Clearance
- Homeowners who need help with cleanup will sign a waiver of liability
- All crew leaders will communicate with project leader for block assignment, work projects, and needs assessments

Village Creek North Block Map




