WARRANT INFORMATION

Beginning Thursday, February 1, 2007, the Plano Police Department and the Plano Municipal Court will add an internet payment option as an additional service for the payment of Municipal Court warrants. This service, offered through credit card service provider Government Payment Service, Inc. (GPS) of Indianapolis, allows defendants the option of paying for their warrant(s) online or via telephone. Using this new service, defendants will no longer be required to appear in person or use cash to pay their warrant(s). They now can log onto the GPS website or call the toll-free number (888-604-7888), twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week to make a payment.

The credit cardholder will need Plano's 4-digit pay location code (1530), the defendant's personal identifier and the total amount due. The instructions on the GPS webpage will guide them through the rest of the process. For complete information please visit

This service is provided free of charge to the City of Plano. Defendants who use the service will pay a fee for the service through their credit card provider. Most major credit cards are accepted—Visa, MasterCard, Discover and American Express.

GPS is an Indianapolis-based company which contracts with over 1,000 agencies nationwide as a third-party credit card processor for consumer payments to government agencies. In 2005, GPS processed over \$47 Million in transactions for government agencies. This was all done with no cost or risk to the government agency. “The (credit) cardholder pays the fee for using the service,” says Dale Conrad, founder and CEO of GPS. “On the next business day, we reconcile the payment with the government office and then forward the full amount of the base payment to the agency.” Using GPS is an excellent opportunity for Plano to be at the forefront in offering a convenient, flexible way to pay warrants.
