




# What the heck is a cubic yard, and how big is it anyway?



Bulk materials of Plano Pure Products are typically sold in the units of “cubic yards”. A cubic yard (or “cy”) contains 27 cubic feet (cf). Try to picture a box made with the dimensions of a yard stick which is three feet on edge, and that would be a cubic yard. The following examples of pickup trucks show their capacities in cubic yards. To calculate the volume of your vehicle or trailer, do the following:

$$\underline{\text{Length (ft) x Width (ft) x Depth (ft)}} = \text{Cubic Yards}$$




